Examinations are conducted under proper supervision, Answer-books are coded, evaluations are done by subject experts, students are allowed to verify or query on their evaluated marks. Reasonable grievances are rectified. As per course rechecking/evaluation done by nominated external/Internal subject experts being recommended by the Vice-Chancellor.

To assess the improvement in research work evaluation is done on the basis of every three month progress report submitted by the researcher. University level projects have been funded to the faculty. The university encourages its faculty to attend state, national and international conferences/workshops/seminars on their related fields. The university has established linkage with local institutions and organizations. University encourages faculty members to undertake research programmes funded by external agencies as well. The university encourages all the faculty to conduct research up to the level of minor research project.

- भाग 'अ' अध्यापक के विषय में प्रतिक्रिया संबंधित 'विषय वस्तु की तैयारी' 'छात्रों से भाव संबंध' एवं 'शिक्षक की विषय वस्तु पर समझ एवं जागरूकता' से संबंधित बिंदुओं पर विद्यार्थियों ने अपनी सकारात्मक प्रतिक्रिया दी है।
